Dr. David Doran is the senior pastor of Inter-City Baptist Church and President of Detroit Baptist Theological Seminary. He serves as the Chairman of the Practical Theology Department and teaches the core pastoral theology courses in the M.Div. program.

Dr. Doran received a B.A. from Bob Jones University and both the M.Div. and Th.M. from DBTS. He earned his D.Min. from Trinity Evangelical Divinity School.

Over several decades at ICBC, Dr. Doran has conducted an effective expository preaching and teaching ministry, established Grace Baptist Mission, and expanded outreach through campus evangelism and discipleship, mission conferences and more.

Dr. Doran is supported faithfully by his loving wife, Claudia.

Brent Belford

Colonial Baptist Church

Pastor Brent became the senior pastor of Colonial in 2016. He and his wife Carissa moved to Virginia Beach from Minneapolis along with their five children. He enjoys spending time with his family, playing golf, and cheering for the Pittsburgh Pirates and Steelers.

Brent loves preaching and teaching the Scriptures and developing future church leaders. His desire to serve the church and academy led him to complete doctoral degrees in pastoral ministries (D.Min., Northland International University) and New Testament studies (Ph.D., Ridley College, Melbourne).

Amid the busyness of pastoral ministry, Brent occasionally reviews biblical resources (for the Gospel Coalition, Master's Seminary Journal, etc.), enjoys presenting at academic, evangelical conferences (e.g., Evangelical Theological Society, Institute of Biblical Research), and teaching biblical exposition courses and workshops at several seminaries and pastor's meetings worldwide.

KEVIN BAUDER serves as the Research Professor of Systematic Theology at Central Baptist Theological Seminary. He also serves as the pastor of Bible Baptist Church in East Bethel, MN. He was born in Midland, Michigan, and received his primary education in Michigan public schools and his secondary education in central Iowa. He holds a B.A. from Faith Baptist Bible College, an M.Div. and Th.M. from Denver Baptist Theological School, a D.Min. from Trinity Evangelical Divinity School, and a Ph.D. from Dallas Theological Seminary. He married Debra Wright, and has two children: Rachel and Joshua.

His non-academic interests include outdoorsmanship, gunsmithing, and the shooting sports, as well as a love for the fine arts.

Areas of academic pursuit include ecclesiological issues, Baptist history and polity, and the study of American fundamentalism and evangelicalism.

Grant Castleberry

Capital Community Church

Grant Castleberry became the senior pastor of Capital Community Church in August of 2019. As senior pastor of Capital, Grant is responsible for preaching the Word of God, shepherding, caring for, discipling, and equipping the saints for the work of ministry, and working with the elders to cast the overall vision for Capital. Grant completed his undergraduate work at Texas A&M University, while also serving in the student body elected positions of junior yell leader and then head yell leader his senior year. He holds a Master of Divinity (MDiv) degree and a Master of Theology (ThM) degree in Historical Theology from The Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in Louisville, KY. Grant is also pursuing a Phd at Southern, writing on Dr. D. Martyn Lloyd-Jones Grant was commissioned as an officer in the United States Marine Corps upon graduation from Texas A&M in 2007. He served primarily overseas as an air traffic control officer and then as a series commander at Parris Island, South Carolina, where he was promoted to the rank of captain. Upon finishing active duty service, Grant entered full-time gospel ministry serving in churches in South Carolina, Kentucky, and Texas as well as the executive director for the Council on Biblical Manhood and Womanhood.

The emphasis of Grant's preaching ministry is on the Christ-centered, verse-by-verse, and sequential exposition of the Bible, experientially applying the Word of God to the Christian life. Grant is also passionate about evangelizing the lost and discipling believers so that they reach maturity in Christ. Grant writes periodically for Tabletalk Magazine. 



WHO IS IT FOR?

Seminary students who select the Biblical Counseling concentration for their Master of Divinity degree at Detroit Baptist Theological Seminary

WHAT'S INVOLVED?

Upon completion of the following courses in the Biblical Counseling concentration, an MDiv student will fulfill all the requirements for ACBC certification.

- Phase 1 (Learning) and 2 (Exams)
 - PT520 Introduction to Biblical Counseling
 - PT527 Marriage and Family Counseling
 - PT535 Counseling Problems and Procedures
- Phase 3 (Supervised Counseling)
 - PT611 Biblical Counseling Practicum I
 - PT612 Biblical Counseling Practicum II

HOW MUCH DOES IT COST?

The courses taken for credit are \$245 per credit hour in the Master of Divinity program and \$275 per credit hour in the Master of Theology program.

WHO IS IT FOR?

Current pastors, men and women who are not pursuing a seminary degree, or seminary students not in the biblical counseling concentration


